I tried it a couple of times and it was forever before my guests finally got to eat. So I asked a friend of mine who does this all the time and she gave me some great tips that I thought I would share just in case there are other people out there who don't know how to do it either.

1) Don't expect too much out of yourself. It can be easy to think you need to do this or that for company but try to remind yourself that the point is fellowship, not perfection. If you hadn't invited this or that family over, they would probably be rummaging through the fridge for leftovers right now. So even if all you served was sandwiches, chips, and fruit, it would still be delightful, because food eaten with others always tastes better!

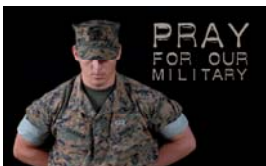

- Spaghetti with garlic bread and salad: You can make the spaghetti sauce the night before so all you have to do after church is cook the noodles and warm up the sauce and garlic bread
- Store bought lasagna, bake potato, or other casseroles: You can turn on the oven before church on a lower level, throw the casserole in and it will be ready when you get home
- Sandwiches with fruit and chips: All of this can be prepared the night before and just brought out when ready to eat
- Chili or soup warming in a crock pot: Just throw the chili or soup together before church. If you want to serve dessert, store bought ice cream or other frozen treats are easy to serve and always a hit.

3) If you are nervous about how things are going to go, do a trial run with close friends who will love you even if things don't go as planned.

4) If after church is a stressful time for your family, try inviting people over some other time of the week and the same advice above applies.

Hope these tips embolden you to step outside your comfort zone and open your home to others.
