Gregg's Good News

Two weeks since Irene Strawn's 2nd stroke. She is on Hospice at her apt. in Park Place. Thoughts of her commitment to Christ continue to occupy me.

After World War II, my Dad used his G. I. bill benefits at Oregon Technical Institute of Klamath Falls. Married with 2 children, he asked, "What is the shortest program you have?" So began his training in Office Equipment repair. Following months in the classroom, on the Job training at Loehr Office Equipment in Corvallis came next.

Once funds ran out for on the job training, John Loehr told my Dad, "You'll either have to find another position or buy the business." Shortly thereafter, my parents were proprietors of Strawn Office Equipment.

As a baby and toddler, I grew up amidst the typewriters, adding machines and file cabinets. Early in the process, a customer came in to observe that my Dad was gone on a service call while my Mom answered the phone, waited on customers and wrangled me. The man asked my Mom, "How are you ever going to make it in business?" My Mom instantly answered, "With the Lord's help." The man responded, "With that kind of attitude, you'll make it." Indeed,

my parents retired from the business and sold it shortly before computers made many of their products obsolete.

Irene frequently taught our Wednesday night Bible class. She would prepare to teach while at work, without the assistance of teaching material. Frequently, she would type 5-6 copies of our fill-in-the-blank question handouts that she created herself. With carbon paper, she would type the questions once, and trust the carbon paper to transfer the writing all the way to the bottom page. (Hence the term "carbon copies")

What is my fix when I know I should pray or serve or worship or live holy? Let the story sink in. Be challenged by it. Make an end of the year commitment to pursue God completely and see how faithful He is.
